## The School Day

A reminder of our school day times.

## Key Stage 2

- Children line up on the yard with their class teacher at 8:45am
- Classroom doors close at 8:50am
- Children arriving after this time must enter through the main office and will be marked late.

Reception and Key Stage 1

- Children line up on the yard with their class teacher at 8:50am
- Classroom doors close at 8:55am
- Children arriving after this time must enter through the main office and will be marked late.

PLEASE NOTE: All registers close at 9:10am. If your child arrives after this time, they will receive an unauthorised late mark which will count as an unauthorised absence and can lead to a Penalty Notice being issued from the Local Authority.

The table below highlights just how much education could be missed by being late to school.

| Minutes late per day during the school <br> year | Equal days' worth of teaching lost in a <br> year |
| :---: | :---: |
| 5 minutes | 3 days |
| 10 minutes | 6.5 days |
| 15 minutes | 10 days |
| 20 minutes | 13 days |
| 30 minutes | 19 days |




BIRTHDAY ATTENDANCE


Your child is able to come into school wearing their own clothes if their birthday falls on a school day. Clothing and footwear must be school/weather appropriate - particularly if it is a PE day, ie trainers to be worn. If your child is lucky enough to have a birthday at the weekend or during a school holiday this would not apply.

## Holidays During Term Time

Absence will not be authorised during term time except in exceptional circumstances. It is important that all parents and carers understand that children with unauthorised absences, including holidays, and unexplained absences are at risk of received a Fixed Penalty Notice.

During the last academic year there were a large number of school days missed by our pupils due to unauthorised holidays. This continues to be a concern for us here at Sherdley and it is something that we wish to work with our parents on to improve. Unfortunately, there were 188 days missed by our pupils last year due to unauthorised holidays taken during term time. May we take this opportunity to remind all of our parents/carers that time off during term time is only allowed in exceptional circumstances.
