

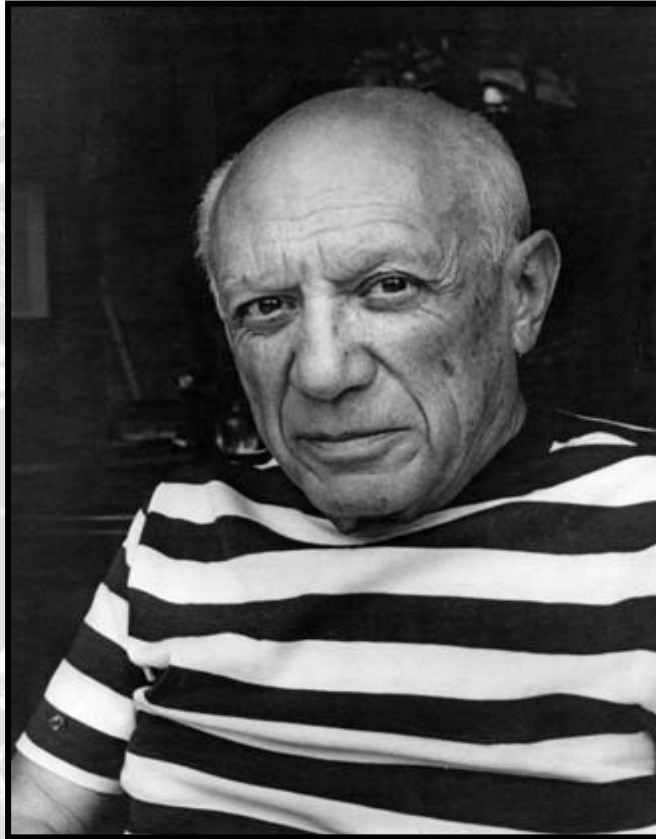

Picasso is thought to have made about 50,000 artworks during his lifetime, including paintings, drawings, prints, sculpture, and ceramics. From his extensive production there are many celebrated pieces.

Did you know?

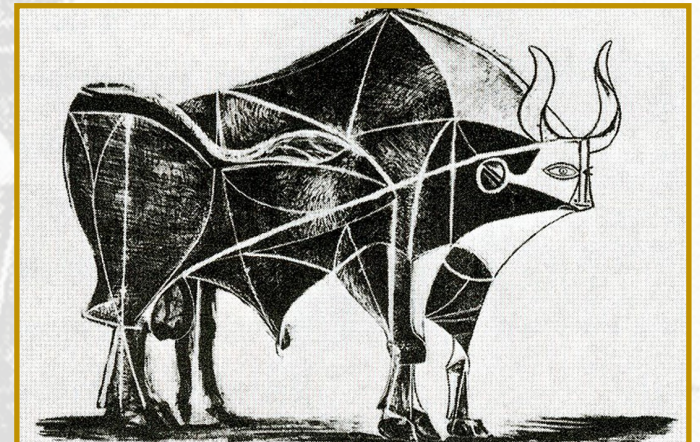
- ⇒ Pablo Picasso hosted his first exhibit in Barcelona, Spain at 19 years old.
- ⇒ Picasso's artwork has sold for over \$100 million in the 21st century.
- ⇒ Picasso created over 20,000 art pieces in a wide range of mediums, including ceramics and theatre sets.
- ⇒ Picasso's art has been featured at the Metropolitan Museum of Art (New York City), Museu Picasso in Barcelona, and the Sofia Reina Museum in Madrid.

Who was Picasso?

Picasso was a Spanish expatriate painter, sculptor, printmaker, ceramicist, and stage designer, one of the greatest and most-influential artists of the 20th century.

This particular painting came at the end of the series of paintings, prints and drawings that Picasso made in protest to the Spanish civil war.

Cubism

Cubism is an art technique created by Picasso and Georges Barque when they worked together between 1909-1912 in Paris, France.

It is considered the most influential art movement of the 20th century and consequently changed the ways in which people think about the role of art.



Les Demoiselles d'Avignon (1907) (Left)

One of the first Cubist works, and, by rejecting illusionism, which art practice had favoured since the Renaissance,.

Guernica (1937) (Right)

A large black-and-white oil painting executed in 1937 following the German bombing of Guernica, a city in Spain's Basque region.
