Remote Education Plan 2020-2021

At Sherdley Primary School, our main form of communication with parents/carers is our school app, we also use ClassDojo to communicate with you. In the event of children being absent from school due to coronavirus, or a bubble has to isolate, or school has a lockdown, teachers will update the Microsoft Teams / ClassDojo class portfolios regularly, set pupils' work and provide feedback, when appropriate. Hard copies of pupils' work can be collected/delivered/posted to accommodate families with special circumstances.

Timetable

Teachers will be provided with a weekly timetable (see below) with a summary of each lesson that will take place. Links will be provided in this timetable to where parents and children can find the online teaching videos and resources for each lesson.

The expectation of lessons will be:

- Daily reading time
- Maths lesson at least 4 times per week (in KS1 & 2)
- English lesson at least 4 times per week (in KS1 & 2)
- Daily phonics lesson (Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1)
- Weekly spelling and times tables lesson / test (Key Stage 2)
- Daily PE session
- A range of foundation subjects per week (science, history, geography, music, computing, art, RE, PSHE / Mental Health)

Content for Maths

The White Rose Maths scheme is followed across school and White Rose Maths have published home learning videos and resources that link to the same sequence of lessons being used in school. In the event of a partial or full closure, or a child self-isolating, the teacher will inform parents which lessons the class are working on in school so the home learning videos and resources can be used; The Oaks Academy videos may also be used. Teachers may also upload their own input video that can be uploaded to Teams and/or ClassDojo Portfolios.

Content for Phonics

In the event of a full or partial closure, teachers will be able to record a video of the daily phonics lesson for children to watch at home.

In the case of an individual child self-isolating, the teacher will inform parents which resources to access, or work will be sent via Teams/ClassDojo.

Content for English

In the event of a full or partial closure, teachers may record a video of an input, or use an Oaks Academy video for the English focus each day for children to watch as an input session. Phonics will be a focus for Early Years and KS1. KS2 Teachers will continue providing spelling resources for the spelling pattern; there will be a spelling test set each week. Handwriting activities will be set each week for KS1.

Content for Other Subjects

As well as English and Maths, there will be a lesson provided for foundation subjects each week. This will follow the same schemes that are being followed in school. In an event of a full or partial closure, the school curriculum will use either the Oaks Academy lessons when topics match our Curriculum Map, or teachers will provide an input video. For the Oaks Academy no log in information is needed, but a link needs to be provided for pupils. Work completed can be submitted via Portfolio. Where they are not available, teachers will make a video to teach the objective and then set learning tasks for the children to complete and submit. Knowledge organisers may also be provided by class teachers.

Contact with Teachers

In the event of a full or partial closure, teachers will hold daily whole class live sessions via Microsoft Teams (Office 365). The purpose of these will be for the children to all be in contact together as a class; for a morning register to be taken; for the teacher to summarise the learning for that week and for children to share some of the work that they have done.

Access to Technology at Home

A survey was carried out with 343 parents responding; the aim was to find out about access to technology at home and engagement with Remote Home Learning – 99% have access to the internet for remote home learning / 53% had access to a printer that could be used to print worksheets etc / 13 parents (3.8%) stated that they did not want home learning / 20.7% want less than 5 hours per week, 34.4% want between 5-10 hours per week, 31.2% want 10-15 hours per week, 9.9% want more than 15 hours per week / all parents said that their child had at least access to 1 device in the home. This has helped us ‘shape’ our remote home learning offer. There will be approximately 8-10 hours of work per week set by teachers (see the timetable), but additional work can be accessed via the school website Covid Home Learning Page. Where possible we will try not to do work on worksheets, but leave it up to you to provide something that the children can write answers etc. If required, we can provide some paper, or an old exercise book for them to use. We have been provided with 28 laptops by the DfE that can be utilised to support remote home learning; these will be distributed based on an identified criteria.

Logins to Online Learning Platforms

The school subscribes to several online learning resources, which can be accessed at home. It is essential that children and parents have access to all the relevant login details, so when required class teachers will provide details in the event of a closure or self-isolation. The login details will be sent through the Class Dojo app.

Login details should be provided for:

- Microsoft Teams
- Times Tables Rockstars
- IDL
- Monster SATs (Year 2 & 6)
- White Rose Home Learning videos, no login details needed
- Oxford Owl – teachers to set up a class login
- Reading Plus for KS2
- Go Read for recording reading in and out of school (replaces the reading record)

Feedback on Work

Feedback will be given to work sent in on Teams/ClassDojo Portfolios. This will be an acknowledgement that work has been done, with an element of praise for the pupil, along with occasional, specific pointers can be given, i.e. great handwriting, but check the size of your descenders, or a really good piece of research, can you find out a bit more about.....

1. 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Home-schooling advice

Home-schooling is very different to school. It is much better to do things little and often. Your child's class teacher will create a timetable for you (see above), but remember you can adapt this to suit the needs of your child and your household.

1. Create a safe space for learning with all the equipment they will need.
2. Have a consistent routine in place, including start and end times for the day, lunch and break times.
3. Split work up into manageable chunks.
4. Take regular rest breaks and drink plenty of water.
5. Limit screen time and try to be active.
6. Make it fun, trying to incorporate your child's interests as much as possible.
